Dear Parents & Carers,

Thank you to everyone who took part in our pyjama day in aid of Children in Need, we raised £515 for this great cause!

This week a group of Y3/4 pupils accompanied by Miss. Bruce and Mrs. McKrell have begun a four day course entitled Wild Tribe led by a member of the team at EQE. The children and staff will be learning bush craft and fire making skills and once the course is complete we will be reinstating Forest Crew sessions beginning for classes during the spring term.

Thank you to all of the pupils who entered Jeff Smith MP's Christmas card competition. Our school entries have been delivered to his offices today. We have also selected a winner for our school and the design will be used on our Christmas card – This will be announced in our assembly on Monday.

KS1 have been exploring blending primary colours to create secondary colours this week. The children experimented, creating different shades of the secondary colour.






We joined the whole school in raising money for Children in Need last week by wearing their pyjamas to school!




