
In Reception we have been reading the story My Hair by Hannah Lee. The children have created their self portraits by looking closely in a mirror and identifying their features and hair colour.



Wear it loud. Wear it proud.


Wear yellow this World Mental Health Day, 10 October, and show young people they're not alone with their mental health.

We encourage all students to wear their PE t-shirts. On this occasion. we are not expecting donations.








How to get started
