Dear Parents & Carers,

We would like to wish Eid Mubarak to all of our families who celebrated Eid ul Adha last week. Yesterday our EYFS pupils presented an assembly to the whole school and their family members to tell us all about Eid ul Adha – well done to everyone involved!

On Saturday 7th June a huge group of parents, pupils and staff took part in the Didsbury Festival Parade. Over a number of weeks the school community worked tirelessly to produce costumes and props including planets and rockets for our entry 'Rocket to Mars'. I was incredibly proud of everyone involved. While we didn't win this year, you could not fault our enthusiasm with wonderful chants led by our Cheer Squad – Thank you to everyone involved!

On Thursday 5th the June a group of 60 pupils across KS1 and KS2 attended a workshop at Manchester Central Library as part of the 20025 Empathy Festival. The children produced mood puppets in KS1 and Zines in KS2 based on poems and stories. The theme for the festival this year is 'Jump into Someone Else's Story' based on the idea that children can learn to be empathetic through learning about different characters that they meet in books. This year a Skogsmulle Symposium has been held in Manchester, welcoming educators from Japan and Sweden. Broad Oak were asked to host the visitors on Thursday 12th June to share our experiences of outdoor learning in an urban context. The day was a fantastic experience and our visitors loved spending time with our pupils and observing their learning in the outdoor environment. We hope to develop links with some of the schools in the coming months and I am pleased to include some of the pictures from the day.

Once again the Broad Oak Heart's Trail will be running throughout the summer in Fletcher Moss. This time our pupils have been tasked with designing a heart for the summer trail. Your child will be bringing home a template and we would like them to create a heart design and return them to school by Friday 20th June. I can't wait to see your designs and look forward to seeing the chosen designs included in the next trail.

Finally, I would like to remind everyone that our Summer Fair will take place in the school grounds on Sunday 6th July. We would like to extend an invite to all members of our local community beyond our school community. Please save the date and invite your friends and neighbours!

We will also allow ex-pupils aged 16 plus to help support the school at the summer fair. This will include setting up, running a stall and helping to tidy away for the day.


In return the school will offer volunteers a letter to confirm their volunteer efforts at our school to support any of their applications.


